Children took part in a range of bear themed activities, including matching numeral and quantity by pegging bees onto honeypots.





2D Shapes

We've been learning the names of simple shapes and their properties, including circles, triangles, squares and rectangles. These shapes have been used to create pictures, 3D models and also formed using playdough cutters.














People Who Help Us

Following the interest in post generated around Christmas, we created a Post Office in our role play area. This proved hugely popular and provided lots of opportunity for markmaking, such as writing letters, labels, addressing envelopes and creating stamps.

Children visited the Post Office next to preschool to experience weighing parcels, before re-creating this in setting.

This led to a focus on other people who help us, notably the police and fire service.


The emergency control centre was manned regularly, with rescues required for imaginative role play scenarios.





















Lunar New Year

We learned about the Lunar New Year and some of the ways that it is celebrated in different countries.

After watching a video about the celebrations, featuring lion dancing, children made lion masks and decorated a large sheet with felt-tipped pens and paint stampers, before trying out their own dances.

Gold pens were used to adorn red envelopes, which were gifted to loved ones, filled with a chocolate and scissor skills were challenged making lanterns.

After sampling some Chinese foods at snack time, parents, carers and children were invited to join staff at the Lee Garden restaurant, to explore Asian, Chinese and Cantonese cuisine and chips!















Keeping Active

Gross motor skills have been challenged with a variety of equipment and obstacle courses for children to travel across, under and over.

Hoops have proved hugely popular and children have explored different ways of using these: rolling, twirling, hula hooping and jumping into them.













Jurassic Times

Dinosaurs are always a popular choice of toy at pre-school, especially in our outdoor area. They have been exploring the planters and creating footprints in the sandpit. Children have enjoyed excavating the bones from the sandpit and comparing their length.











Water Play

The wet weather has kept the water butt topped up, despite being in continuous use. Children are able to use it independently, transferring the water into a variety of containers and keeping the plants hydrated!



Letter of the Week

Each week we focus on a letter following the order of the Jolly Phonics scheme. We aim for children to learn the name of the letter, the sound it makes and practice writing this letter using a variety of media. So far we have focussed on the letters S, A, T, N, I, P, CK, E, H and R .Next in the sequence are M, D and G.
